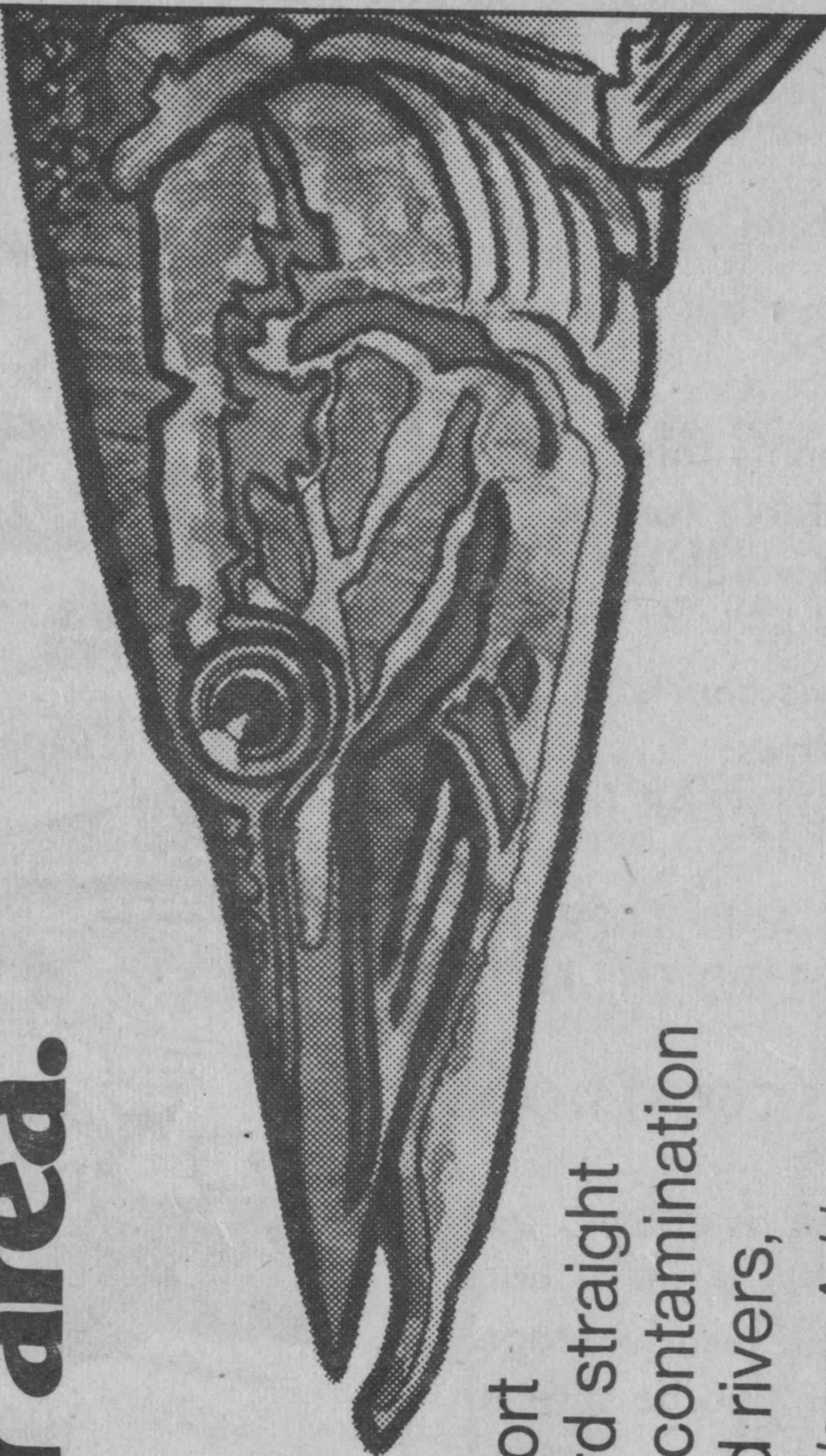


Here is what your Provincial Government is doing to encourage Fishing and Tourism in your area.



A progress report to set the record straight about mercury contamination in our lakes and rivers,

Recently, there have been reports of mercury contamination in a few of our lakes and rivers. These reports could have an adverse effect on the tourist industry of the Province.

Here are the steps we are taking:

1. We have increased our television coverage considerably over major U.S. stations and in Manitoba. And the commercials that millions of people are seeing now are as positive a statement as we can make to convince them that fishing in Ontario has never been better. These commercials show people fishing and enjoying their catch over a beautiful lakeshore dinner.
2. This public information statement you are reading

To correct any misconceptions that may be held as a result of these reports, the Government of Ontario has initiated an aggressive program of information concerning the attractions of fishing in Ontario's lakes.
