

ALLEN-HALES VOWS EXCHANGED



On Saturday, May 16th, 1970 at 2 p.m. at Sheguiandun United Church, Linda Ann, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Hales of Little Current became the bride of William John, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Allen of Little Current. Rev. J. Gordon officiated at the double ring ceremony. Mrs. R. Grigg of Lively, Ont. presided at the organ and during the signing of the register a duet composed of Ann and Rodney Gordon sang "Savior Like A Sheppard Lead Us" and "Walk Hand in Hand".

Given in marriage by her father, the bride looked radiant in a formal gown of nylon organza over rayon taffeta. Daisies enhanced the short sleeves and yolk, bands of guipure lace outlined the empire waist and tiny stand-up collar. A Juliette held her trailing bouffant veil trimmed with guipure lace. She carried a bouquet of white roses, centered with a mauve orchid, and wore cultured pearl earrings, a gift from the groom.
