PLAYGROUND PROGRAMME

The Playground programme commenced on Monday, July 6th, and is open for children 5 years of age and up. Schedule of the Playground programme is as follows: -

- Mondays - Arts and Crafts (Craft Room),
- Tuesdays - Active Games, Quiet Games (wading pool area)
- Wednesdays - Music, Drama, Story-telling (wading pool area)
- Thursdays - Arts and Crafts (Craft Room)
- Fridays - Special Events (Wading Pool lawn area)

Times for the above activities for various age groups will be as follows: -

- 5 and 6 years - 1:00 - 3:00 p.m.; 7 - 9 years - 2:00 - 4:00 p.m.; 10 - 12 years - 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. and 13 years and over - 7:00 - 9:00 p.m.

The Playground staff of Kristine Chopelsky, Joyce Belliveau, Jim Gerlach and Donna Chapman will be on hand to supervise the programme. Children are asked to meet at the Wading Pool lawn area on all days with the exception of rainy days when the children will be required to meet in the arena.

Children are asked to be on time for their activities to gain the most benefit from the sessions. The Playground programme will operate for six weeks only so be sure to take advantage of all the sessions you can. 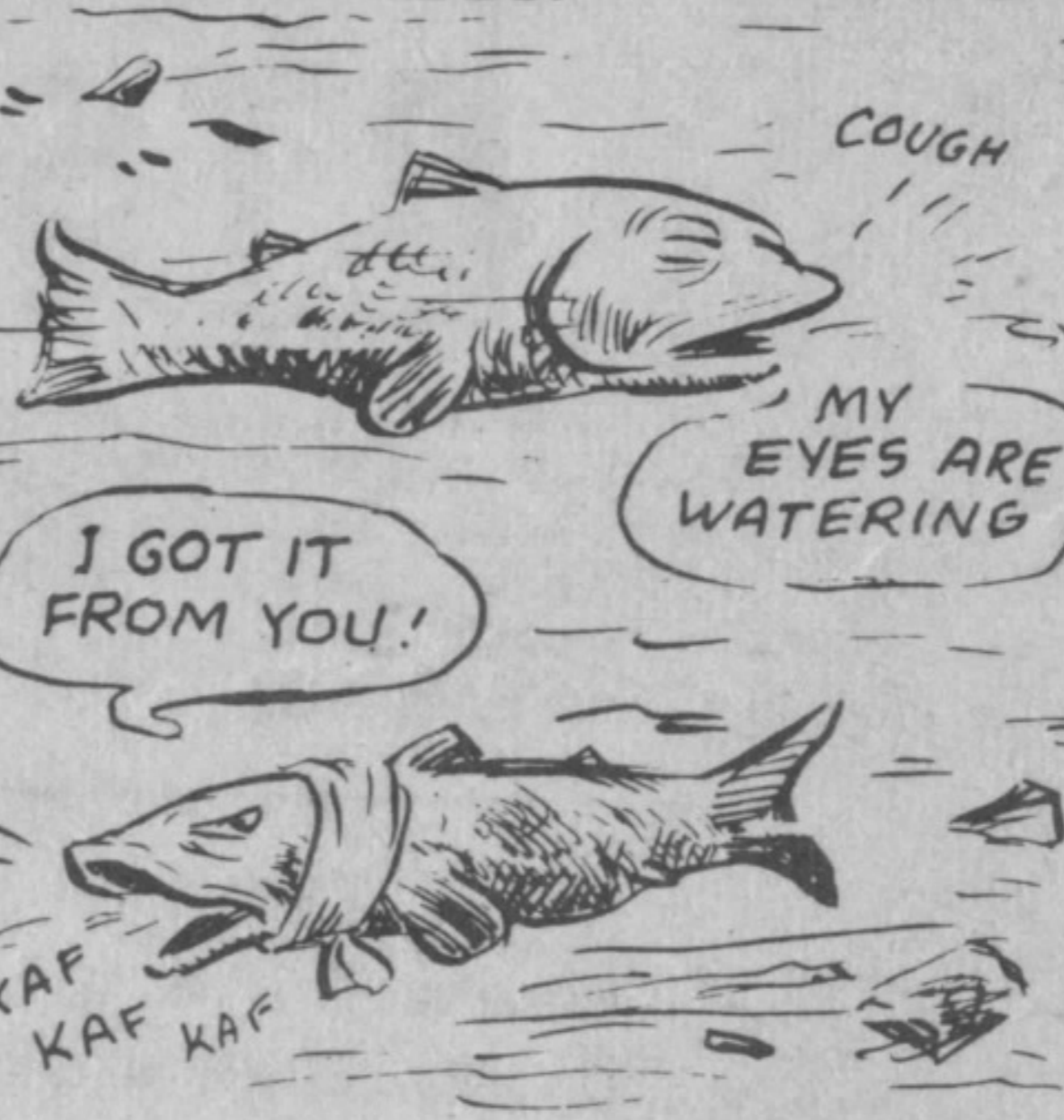
We strongly urge parents of the ballplayers to attend these games as the boys and girls in the league would appreciate your interest. All games are played at the Separate School ballfield.
