SCHREIBER COUNCIL QUOTES

Municipal Council held a special meeting to accept the assessment roll, study school estimates and deal with the 1970 budget.

The assessment roll of \$2,005,300 and estimates for 1970 expenditure were accepted: - General - \$103,000. Schools - \$95,574.
