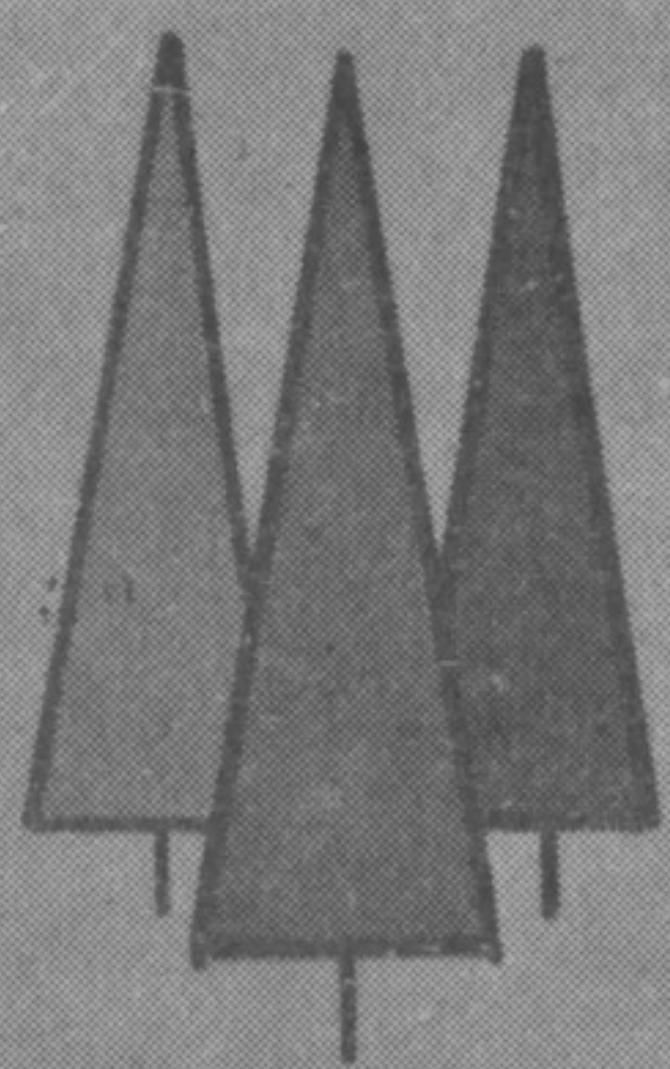


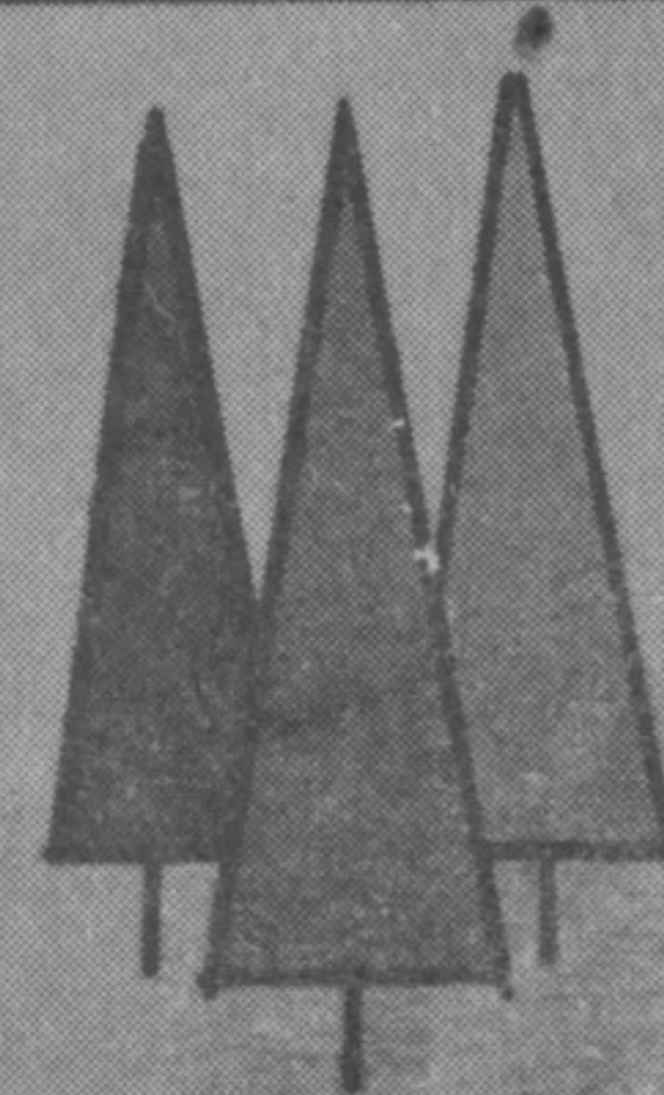

DR. "MIKE" McCAUSLAND HONOURED



The town of Terrace Bay honoured Dr. D.J.M. McCausland for twenty five years of service to the community, in the Terrace Bay Arena, on Saturday evening, August 1st.

In an era when many smaller communities have been without Medical Services, Terrace Bay has indeed been fortunate in having Dr. McCausland ever ready when his services were needed. Not only has he care for the ills of district residents but on many occasions in early years he was called upon to act as a vet for beloved family pets.

An estimated crowd of 1500 turned out to pay tribute to Dr. Mike, as he is affectionately known.

Dr. Mike, his young wife Lois and two little daughters Judy and Susie came to the district in 1946, was Terrace Bay's first doctor, when the present Kimberly-Clark mill was under construction. They lived at Walkers Lake until house 57, Laurier Avenue was erected and they moved to Terrace Bay.
