report on the conference which she attended in Toronto on 'The School System in the Community'.

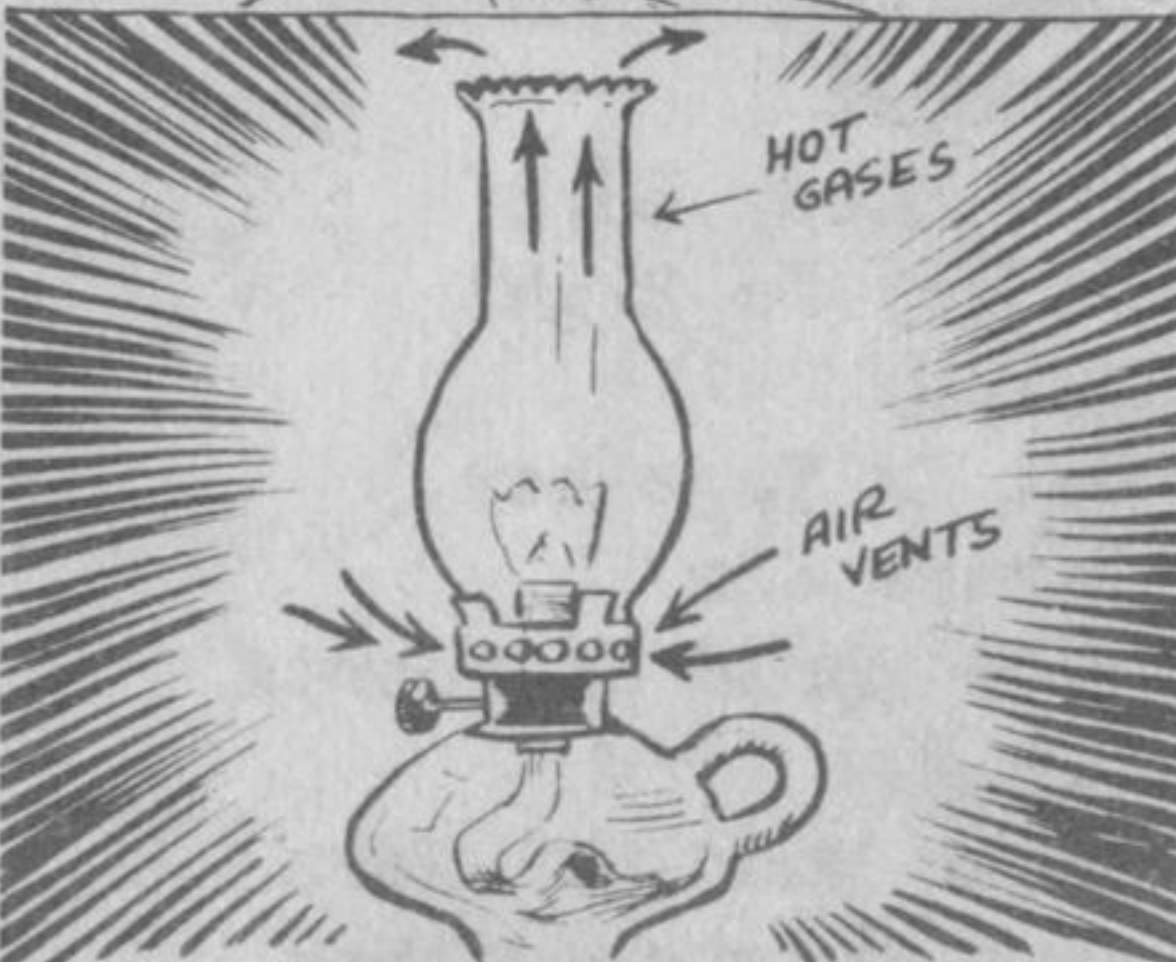
Minutes of the last meeting were adopted.
