and in recent months there has been a noticeable tendency for prices to rise less rapidly. In the first half of the year the rate of increase of the Consumer Price Index in Canada has been about 3 per cent per annum, compared with over 5 per cent a year ago. At the same time, however, public policy has continued to be confronted by two important aspects of economic performance which are distinctly worrying.
