

it from your employer on your behalf.

Employers must also pay the Department a 10% penalty for withholding any money from you.

For the whole story on what these changes mean to you, write or phone your nearest Employment Standards Branch.

For example, if you work for one of an associated group of companies and are assigned to another company in the group for a period of time, you'll get paid for any overtime you work just as if you were still working for the original company. All the other provisions of the Act apply the same way.
