this fall with expenses to be charged against the Community Playground Account, money for which will be received in the form of a grant from the Department of Agriculture.

An assessment was made of the summer programme on the basis of written reports which had been submitted and further details given by those responsible. The swimming programme attracted most attention and a letter from the Red Cross Examiner went into detail outlining possible improvements in the programme. The Examiner stated in his letter that: "the source of the problems plaguing the Schreiber swim programme cannot be attributed to one isolated factor, but is the result of several variables". He then submitted suggestions which may lead to an improvement of the overall programme and higher rate of achievement in the Awards. It was stated in the letter and bears repeating that: "the Awards only serve as an incentive to achieve a goal. The objective of a Red Cross Swimming programme is to produce safe, competent swimmers."

It was mentioned that a combination of the short duration of the programme and part time instruction has produced the high failure rate. It was suggested that the Schreiber Parks and Recreation Committee attempt to hire a full time instructor, whose duties include not only instructing but life-guarding as well, allowing students to practice under supervision outside the regular hours of instruction.

Certain improvements of the beach area were suggested involving the physical facilities such as a dock, guard chair and markers.

A copy of the letter was forwarded to the Kinsmen group of Schreiber with thanks from the Committee for the splendid service rendered by that organization.

Fall activities were discussed including the Figure skating program. Mrs. F. Bryson informed the Committee that an instructor would be hired for four hours per week.
