

CANADA SAVINGS BONDS ON SALE AT THE MILL NOW!

For the 24th consecutive year arrangements are made for Kimberly-Clark employees to purchase Canada Savings Bonds on a Payroll Savings Plan.

In 1969, 315 employees purchased \$153,950.00 of Bonds through the Payroll Savings Plan for an average purchase per buyer of \$489.00.

Twenty-five volunteer canvassers at the mill will contact employees in each crew to give everyone an opportunity to sign up for bonds. A list of the canvassers for each crew is posted on the Mill Bulletin Boards.

Each employee can make the canvasser's job easier if you decide NOW how many Bonds to buy.
