Mr. Bert Lohr of Lakeshore Community Television Limited stated that comments from subscribers as to the quality of reception of this channel would be welcomed and would be helpful to the company in achieving the best possible reception. Application is being made to the Canadian Radio and Television Commission for permanent inclusion of Channel 3 to the system.

A complete up-dating of the cable system is scheduled, the contract already having been let to Bell Canada for the replacement of all existing cable routes. The date of the beginning of this undertaking will be announced later when the date is verified by Bell Canada.
