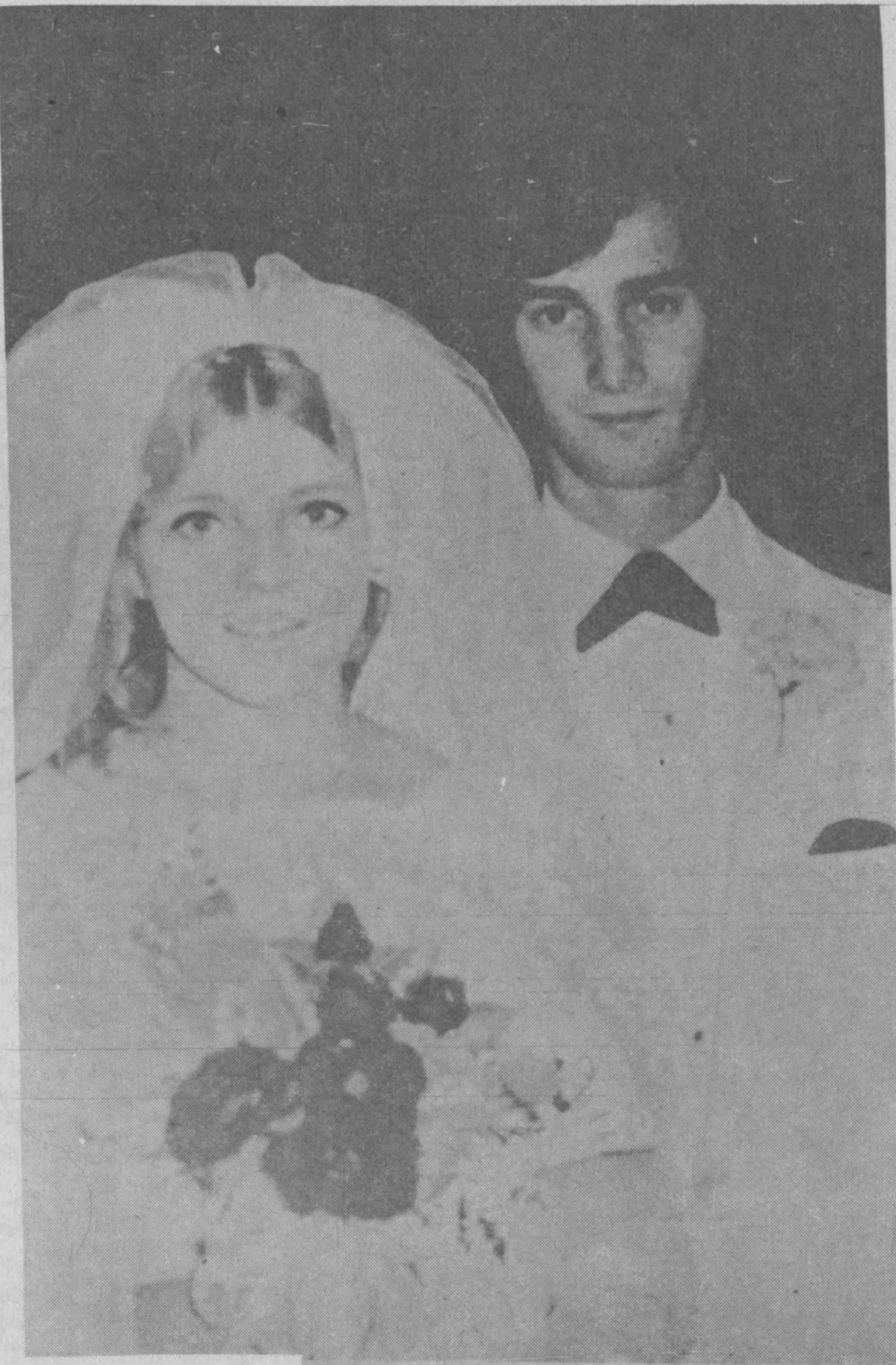


SINGLETON-HAYES UNITED IN ST. MARTIN'S CHURCH
