to develop a good root system. By the time that the roots have filled the pot sprouts will be pretty well developed and they should then be moved to a semi-dark place, about 60° for a week or two and finally to a sunny place but not too close to a sunny window.

The long storage period can be shortened by using bulbs marked "for indoor forcing".
