Week of November 15th, 1970 to November 21st, 1970.

At 3:30 a.m. November 15, 1970 a disturbance was investigated on Peary Street. The two participants Charles Peltier and Arthur Duhamel were issued warnings.

On November 17, 1970 Constable J.E. Wills apprehended a wanted person for Thunder Bay O.P.

P. Lestie Dunbar was arrested and escorted to Thunder Bay.

A quantity of liquor was seized from John Joseph Kelly of Warkworth, Ontario on November 18, 19-70. Kelly was charged with under the provisions of the liquor Control Act.
