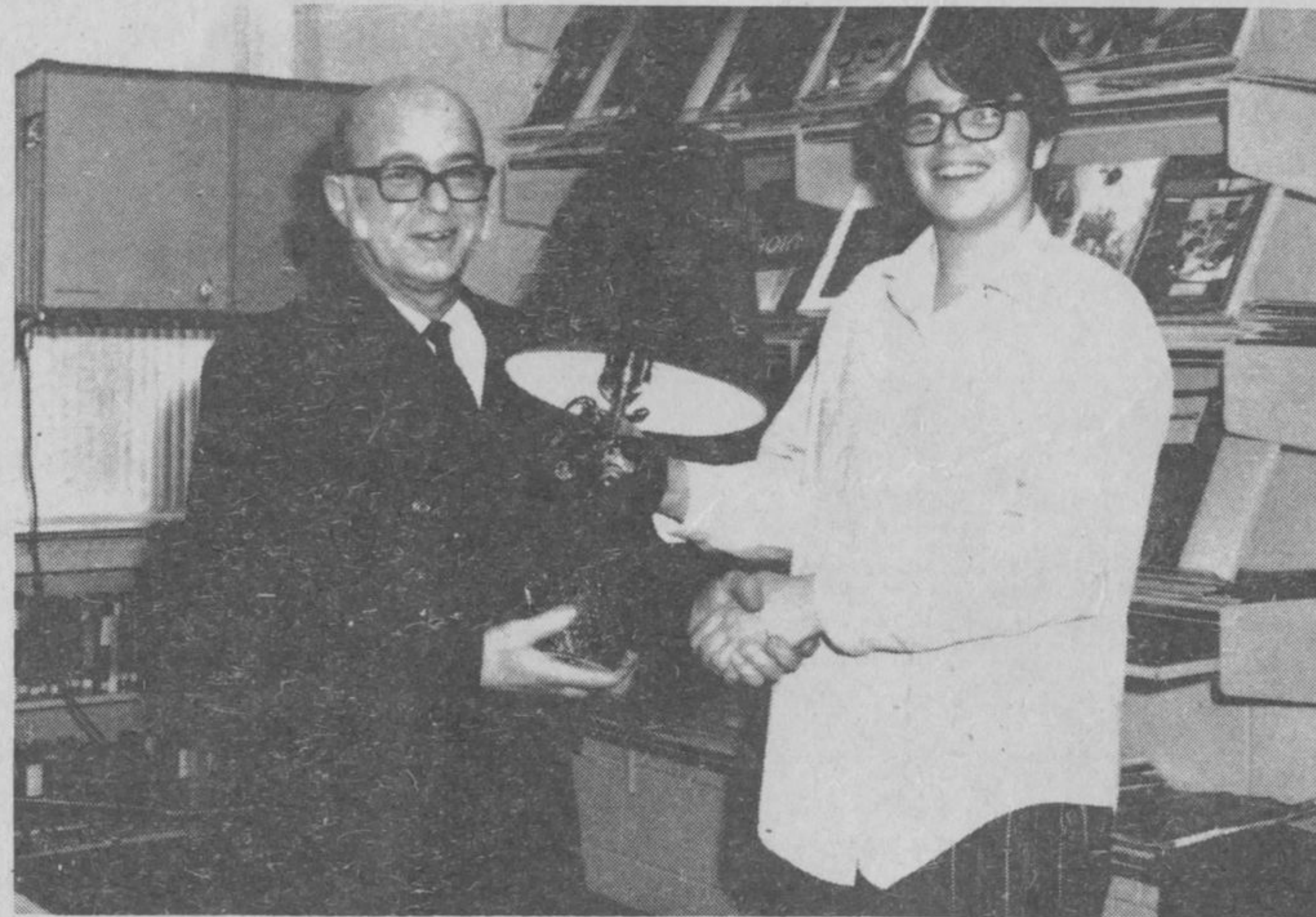
TERRACE BAY PLAYS SCHREIBER
