lent efforts and sportsmanship.

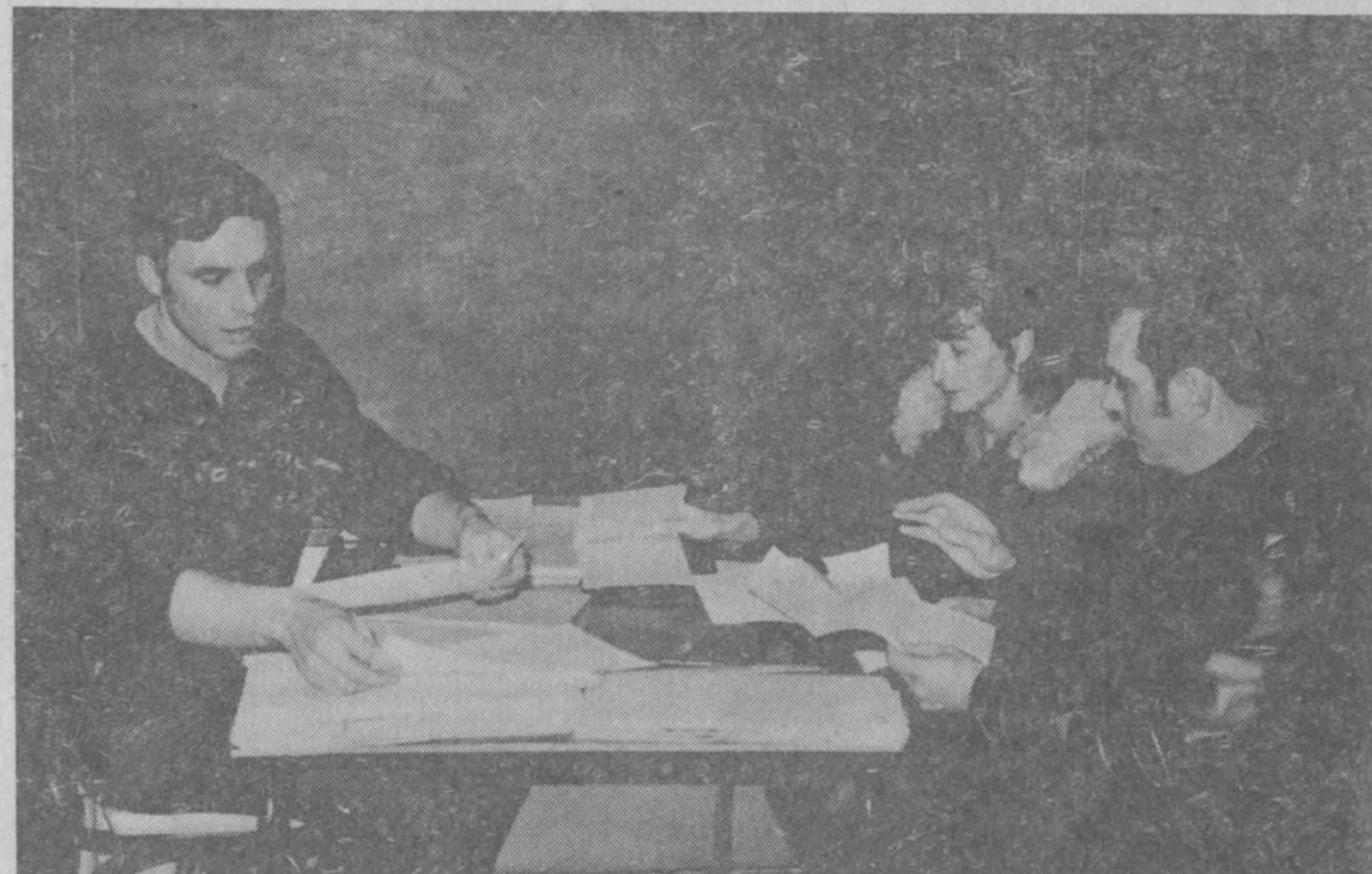
