For some unknown reason the weekend of Feb. 13 and 14th of this year was chosen as the days for the continuation of the Abortion-on-demand campaign to take place in Ottawa.

The Royal Commission on the Status of Women has recommended that "The Criminal Code be amended to permit abortion by a qualified medical practitioner on the sole request of any woman who has been pregnant for 12 weeks or less" but Fetal Heart function can be detected at 12 weeks.

It was suggested by Mrs. G. Dashkewytch that each member take an active part in this campaign by writing our members of parliament expressing opposition to any extension of Abortion Laws. Prime Minister Trudeau commented that changes to liberalize the present abortion legislation would depend on an expression of opinion by a majority of Canadians. So do your part by writing your letters to the members of parliament.
