

Your request for two hours service on Sunday cannot be granted due to the resulting excessive cost. All postal officials and employees have to abide by the Agreement between the Treasury Board and The Canadian Postmasters' Association which stipulates that extra hours must be paid when an employee is required to return to the Post Office for the purpose of unlocking and locking the lock box lobby. Due to the history of vandalism, the re-opening of the lock box lobby on a 24 hour basis cannot be considered at this time.
