In order to improve office and billing procedures, your Hydro Commission has approved a new policy in regards to water heaters on unmetered circuits.

In order to minimize customer inconvenience and and to facilitate the implementation of this new policy, the revision in the wiring will be done by Utility Staff free of charge, commencing April 1st to April 9th, 1971.

In 1955, he pursued further courses in Psychology at Gonzaga University, Spokane, Washington and in 1957, concluded higher studies in Psychology at Seattle University giving him a Master's in Psychology, he was engaged in parish work in Seattle for two years, and was then assigned Chaplain to Firland Sanatorium, Seattle, and Fircrest School for the Mentally Retarded, in Seattle also, Fircrest School had a capacity of 1,000 severely retarded residents. He has been and continues to be, an active members of The American Association of Mental Deficiency, having held regional, as well as national offices with the Association. For three years he was also a member of the Washington State Mental Health
