

REMOVAL PROGRAM

A program designed to curb excessive algal growth in Ontario waterways while stimulating recovery in existing problem areas has been launched by the Ontario Water Resources Commission.

The program, incorporating a timetable, requires the installation of facilities capable of removing a minimum of 80% of phosphorus from sewage at municipal and institutional sewage treatment plants throughout the province.

Phosphorous is one of the essential nutrients for

A 15 year old juvenile from Toronto, reported to have run away from home, was located at Schreiber. Parents and Authorities at Toronto were advised.

A total of 4 property damage accidents occurred during the week. No injuries resulted out of any of the mishaps. Two of the collisions were in the town of Schreiber with a total of approximately 11½ miles north of the Mill on the Kimberly-Clark woodlands road and the 4th occurred approximately 5 miles east of Terrace Bay.
