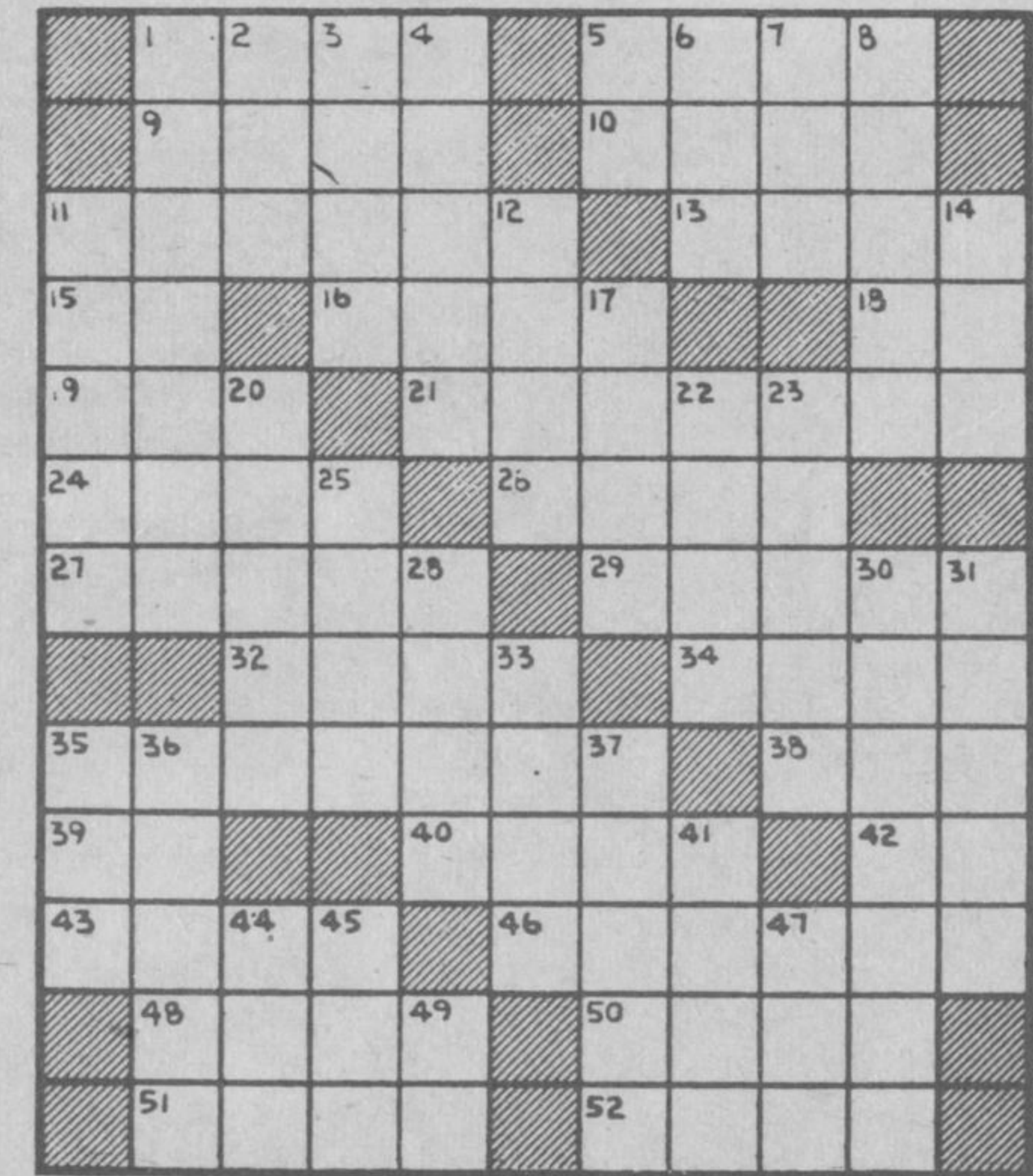
1970-71 CLARKSON COLLEGE JUNIOR VARSITY HOCKEY TEAM
