and notification of such to the Minister of Health.

It was generally agreed that retention of a permanent legal representative to act as required by the Health Unit would be a desirable move, and the matter left with the executive committee for full investigation.

Following a lengthy and lively discussion the Board agreed to the implementation of a Family Planning Program at the clinic facilities in Thunder Bay. It is hoped the clinic will begin in September 1971 and will be available to all those in the Thunder der Bay District Health Unit area.

J.K. Cooke, vice chairman and chairman of finance, presented certain correspondence between the Board and the Province relating to funding during the current year. Despite severe curtailments in various departments the budget proposed will be for all practical purpose unaffected.

The 1970 annual report presented by the Medical Director was favorably received by the entire Board. In the opinion of the Board it had been a successful and productive year. cont'd next column.....
