difficulties on the long curve to the east approach to Schreiber. The Department advised that this matter is being studied, and that a recent field check using a ball bank measuring instrument revealed it was acceptable for safe operation at a slightly greater speed than that posted. However, they stated that the Regional Traffic Office is further investigating, and they intend to implement any recommendation they make concerning speed control and vehicular guidance on this curve.
