The Schreiber Library Board met on August 31, with the following results.

The board had previously presented the Town Council with a budget outlining its financial difficulties in continuing a high standard of service to the pre-schoolers and the adults and in the merging services with the school students. The Town Council assisted the Board with an increased Municipal grant. The Library Trustees expressed their gratitude and put into operation phase one of improvements. Mrs. R. Accounts totalling 1,266.32 were ordered paid. 768 books were exchanged during the month of Aug. The next N.W.R.L. bookmobile exchange will be Monday, November 15th at 9 a.m.
