EXTENION OF MINERAL EXPLORATION PROGRAM

The Cobalt and Gowaganda Mining Areas made eligible for Mineral Exploration assistance earlier this week have been defined and included 127 townships, announces Ontario Mines and Northern Affairs Minister Leo Bernier.

The inclusion of these Townships in the Ontario Government's incentive program will benefit the mining communities of Cobalt, Elk Lake, Gowganda Matachewan, Shining Tree and Temagami, explained Mr. Bernier.

Comapnies and individuals with properties in these areas will now be entitled to a one-third reimbursement of the costs.

Of ground exploration programs, in the same wayas has already been established for the Red Lake, Kirkland Lake and Geraldton-Beardmore areas. Written applications for assistance must be approved in advance by the minister. Applications should contain an adequate description of the property, its mineral possibilities, and an itemized statement of the proposed exploration work and its estimated cost.

Government participation is limited to a maximum of 33,333.33 dollars for each application. At least three-quarters of the exploration work must be completed and reimbursement claimed by March 31, 1972.
