Drill your children in the procedure of crossing streets and warn them of running. Set a specific time they must be home and enforce it, keeping in mind the provisions of the Child Welfare Act. R.S.O. 1970 which states that no child under the age of 16 years shall loiter in any public place between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. unless accompanied by a parent or an adult appointed by the parent. If your child is wearing a commercially produced mask be absolutely positive that there are large enough spaces for them to see through. Dress them in costumes

that will reflect and not absorb light and if you are driving your car that special night watch for youngsters who have forgotten to watch for you.
