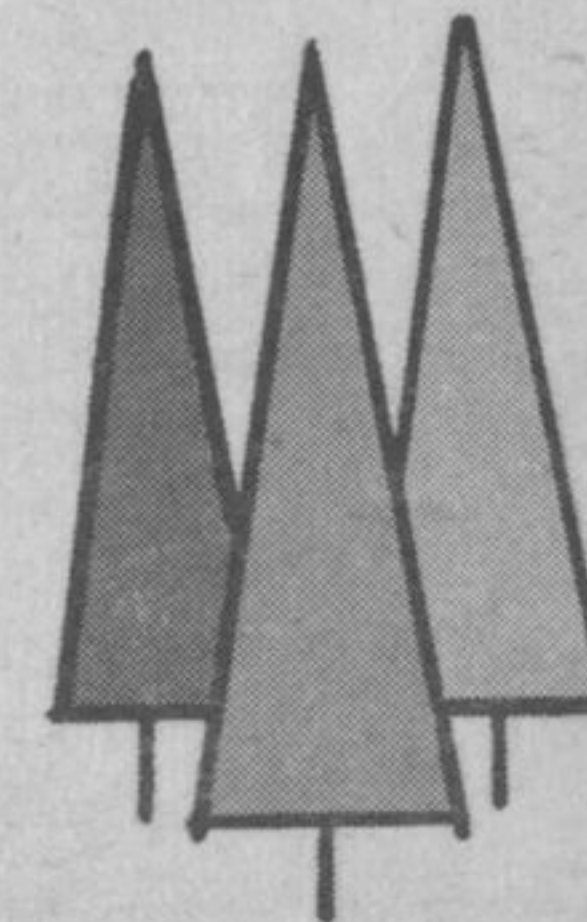

## COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met in regular session on Tuesday evening, with the Reeve and all councilors present. Minutes were read and adopted. Correspondence included a letter from the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 223, Terrace Bay, requesting permission to sell poppies on November 10th, and also to fly the Legion Poppy flag on the Town standard. Request granted.

A thank you note was received from Mrs. Peggy Wellings, for the donation of pen sets to be taken on her curling trip to Scotland, and presented to various hostesses there.

In response to several inquiries regarding the problem of "earwigs" around their property, the representative of the Thunder Bay Health Unit will be contacted for advice on behalf of the people concerned.

A letter from Kimberly-Clark brought to the attention of Council that a severe problem exists in the Sanitary Land fill area, in that residents are dumping trash etc., in a haphazard manner, causing a considerable increase in labour time, and equipment trying to maintain the area in accordance with Provincial legislation.

The costs of these additional clean-ups is quite extensive, and no doubt will be felt by the tax payer, if this condition continues.

Correspondence from W.L. Wardrop, Associates, Consulting Engineers, revealed that a feasibility study on the proposed pool enclosure should be in the hands of Council by the end of November.
