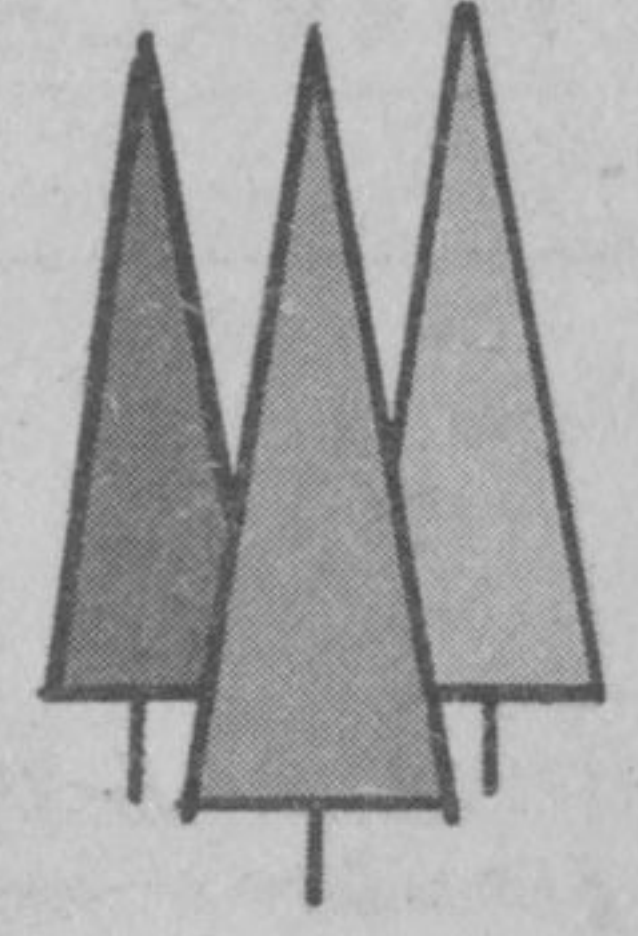

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met in the only regular session for December in council chambers on Tuesday evening.

Correspondence included a reply from Premier William Davis regarding a telegram sent him by the Association of Mayors and Reeves, endorsed by Reeve Cavanaugh, about the ban on studded tires in Northern Ontario. Mr. Davis advised that a study determined by the Safety Council indicated studded tires are not as safe as standard tires.

An extensive report on the progress of North-western Ontario was received from Alexander Phillips, manager of the Northwestern Ontario Development Council.

Doug Whicker, on behalf of the ski club, requested permission from council to hold a torchlight run and a huge bonfire, to be held at the ski hill in conjunction with the February Winter Carnival. Council gave approval, and the fire department will be advised of their decision.

Dave Henderson of the Community Planning Board, advised he will be in Terrace Bay, early in January, to discuss zoning bylaws.

A request was received from the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 223, Terrace Bay, to re-zone the existing uses relating to the present Legion property in order that they may proceed with their planned expansion. This request will be dealt with by council within the next month or six weeks.

V. Mazone, administrator of McCausland Hospital made a request to have the local Volunteer Fire Brigade provide maintenance for fire fighting equipment at the hospital, and provide fire prevention and care.
