EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION FOR PARENTS

The Lake Superior Board of Education announces a two-part course on Early Childhood Education for Parents of present or prospective Kindergarten and Primary pupils of its educational system.

Part One - The Developmental Processes of the Child - scheduled for Terrace Bay Public School on Wednesday, January 12th from 7 to 9 p.m. and Schreiber Public School Thursday, January 13, 7 to 9 p.m.

Part Two - How Parents can Facilitate the Developmental Process - scheduled for Terrace Bay Public School on Wednesday, January 19th from 7 to 9 p.m. and Schreiber on Thursday, January 20th from 7 to 9 p.m.

PREREGISTRATION will take place at Terrace Bay and Schreiber Public School between the hours of 3 and 5 p.m. on Friday, January 7, 1972.

Registration is limited; parents will be accommodated on a first come, first served basis. Registration fee is one dollar. The program format will consist of slides, VTR tapes, lectures and discussions led by Ontario Department of Education Consultants.

The Student Council will sell Carnival Buttons starting in January. These buttons will entitle the wearer to free entry to some events and at a reduced price at others.

It is expected that a list of events will be available as soon as all are confirmed. Tentatively, there will be slide races, hockey, basketball, beard-growing, Carnival Open contest, parade of floats, and many other all designed to involve everyone in the community.

The committee hopes YOU will plan to be a part of Terrace Bay's Winter Carnival on February 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 1972.

HOSPITAL BOARD MEETING

The McCausland Hospital Board of Governors held a luncheon meeting on December 16, 1971, at the Terrace Bay Motor Hotel.

Donald G. Beno, Chairman - Public Relations Committee recommended and received approval that a \$3.00 fee be charged to become a Member of the Hospital Corporation which allows that person to vote at the first Annual meeting (March 15, 1972). Rena McAdam has arranged for the printing of Membership cards and Thor Olsen will assist in the preparation of news releases regarding the Membership Drive and Annual Meeting.

J.A. Ferrier, Board Chairman, noted that the objective of the Board is to encourage the general public to take an active interest in their hospital and its future health planning. He reported that the hospital has not yet received the bed-needs study from the Ontario Hospital Commission but will press for the completion of this report as soon as possible.

Victor Mazzone, Administrator, presented a list of immediate capital equipment needs of approximately \$10,000. which will be required in the early part of 1972. Proposals to join the Hospitals of Ontario Pension Plan and
