attended the meeting, to point out the dangers of snow machines operating in and around the school premises, particularly at the time the smaller children are leaving the school. Mr. MacLeod elaborated on the dangers with respect to small children being allowed by parents to operate these machines. Reeve Cavanaugh thanked Mr. MacLeod for his interest and assured him that Council would take his warnings into serious consideration.

The Department of Transportation and Communications gave approval by By-law 242, restricting the use of snow machines between the hours of 12 midnight and 7 a.m., and this by-law will be rigidly enforced.

The Ontario Council, Order of St. John's, asked Council for financial support. Council agreed that the locality is always well served by the Schreiber branch of the St. John's Ambulance Corps and at this time a grant of \$25.00 was made, with a further grant to be discussed at a later date.

An order was received from the Ontario Municipal Board granting the appeal lodged by the Township
