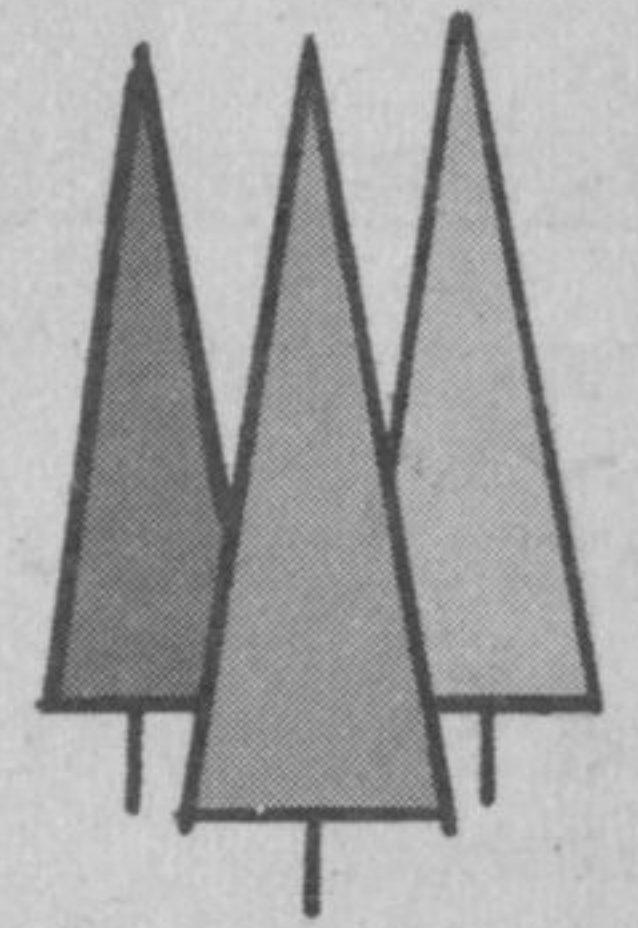

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met in regular session on Tuesday evening. Reeve Cavanaugh presided.

An annual grant was authorized to the North-western Ontario Development Council. Mr. Cavanaugh was appointed as a director for Terrace Bay.

Correspondence included a letter from the Terrace Bay Horticultural Society, requesting permission to do public planting in Centennial Park and in front of the bank. They also requested permission to hold a bedding plant sale in June. These requests were granted.

A notice of a sitting of the Assessment Review Court for the Township of Terrace Bay was received to be held on Wednesday, January 26th at 10 a.m.

The Department of Transportation and Communication advised of the annual subsidy maintenance allocation in the amount of \$10,000 for maintenance and \$2,000 for construction.

The Boy Scout Association asked permission to hold a parade on Sunday, February 13th, in conjunction with the Winter Carnival.

The Recreation Committee submitted terms of office for the new members of the Recreation Committee.

The O.M.E.A. and the A.M.E.U. will hold their annual meeting in Toronto on February 27th to March 1st. Clerk-Treasurer Bill Hanley, Reeve Cavanaugh and Councillor Roy Bray were authorized to attend, with Joe Kennedy named as an alternate delegate.
