6 - 1/2 ton pickups approximately 6 months (rear bumpers required)

5 - 1/2 ton pickups approximately 3 to 4 months (rear bumpers required)

12 - 12-passenger vans approximately 2 months

1 - 1 ton stake truck approximately 4 to 6 months

3 - crewcabs, 6-passenger, approximately 3 to 5 months.

Vehicles will be required during period May 1st to October 31st, 1972.
