Douglas Fir is the largest tree in Canada. It is known to reach heights greater than 300 feet with diameters up to fifteen feet. The trunk is straight and free of limbs for seventy feet and more. The heavy, strong wood produced from Douglas Fir trees is ideal for large size structural timbers, and is obtainable clear from defect for a wide range of other uses.

B.C. forests produce three true firs: Abies Amabilis, Abies Grandis, and Abies Lasiocarpa (Amabilis fir, Grand fir, and Alpine fir). The renowned Douglas Fir, often called false Hemlock or Pseudotsuga taxifolia, is not a true fir. Cones on the Douglas fir hang down, while in true firs the cone stands upright on the branch.
