HALF-LOADING RESTRICTIONS

Half-Loading Restrictions will go into effect on all Highways and Secondary Roads in the Thunder Bay District EXCEPT the following:

- (1) All of Highway 11.
- (2) All of Highway 11B.
- (3) All of Highway 17.
- (4) All of Highway 61.
- (5) Highway 102 from 4.6 Miles East of Highway 11 at Sistonen's Corners Easterly to Highway 11 in Thunder Bay.
- (6) Highway 584 from Highway 11 to the South Limit of Geraldton.
- (7) All of Highway 623.
- (8) All of Highway 628.
- (9) All of Lakeshore Drive.

During Half-Loading Season, no special permits for overloading or house moving will be issued on any Highway in this District.

In expressing his regret at the necessity of closing these facilities, Mr. Bernier said; "It is a matter of economics and since the Government's budget required that two offices be phased out, I had to decide regretfully that the two with the smallest number of transactions should go."

Raceday will again be on Sunday evening, with rain-out races being run on Monday evening.

Another of the rule changes is that all persons in the pit area must wear white pants and white shirts or white overalls. This is a change from previous years where white pants only could be worn.
