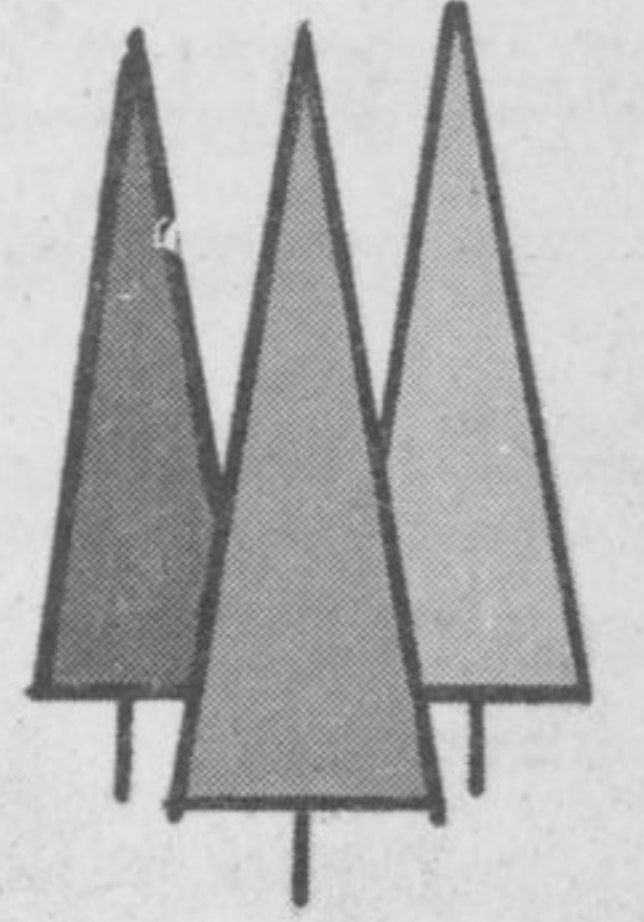

COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met in regular session on Tuesday evening. Minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

Upon the recommendation of the Recreation Committee, Council passed a resolution to hire Roy Cornfield as caretaker at the Recreation Centre.

The A.M.E.U. District 3 meeting will be held in Thunder Bay on Wednesday, April 19th. Mr. Don Stewart and Mr. Bill Hanley have been authorized to attend.

A copy of a letter to the Township lawyers was read, advising them of the proposed revisions to the zoning by-law.
