

TERRACE BAY COUNCIL MEETING

The Terrace Bay Council met on Tuesday evening, with all present. Minutes were adopted as read. A letter from Kimberly-Clark Pulp and Paper Co. stated that they have offered to make available to the Township, at no charge, a pipe thawing machine.

Another letter from the manager of Kimberly-Clark, Mr. J. A. Ferrier, advised Council that as well as possible replacement of ice making machinery, the Recreation Association would be expected to provide a new heating system for the Recreation complex.

A letter from the Dept. of Justice, Fire Marshall's Office, stated that there would be a Regional Firemen's School held in Atikokan from June 5-9. Two volunteer firemen from the Terrace Bay Dept. have been authorized to go.
