These six students have been invited to attend a banquet at Lakehead University on April 22. At that time pins will be awarded to Pat and Jade for scoring top marks in their respective campus.

ART EXHIBIT

Schreiber Campus hosted an Ontario Arts Council touring exhibit of the works of Reinhard Reitzenstein and Don Halstead. It is a combination of two artists' very different approaches to their discipline.

Halstead's wildlife studies represent samplings of his water colours, inks, oils, and etching prints done over a period of the last thirteen years.
