ORGANIZATION OF BIBLE SOCIETY REVIEWED

The annual meeting of the Bible Society was held in the United Church hall on May 16th.

Rev. W.J. Moore, of North Bay, presided and spoke on the early organization of the Bible Society which began in London, England, in 1804, for the purpose of translating and printing the Scriptures as well as providing a price which people can pay for them. In Canada the Scriptures are translated into Eskimo and Ojibway languages.

A film "The Finest Gold" was shown, concerning the industries and customs of people in Thailand where the State religion is largely Buddhist. A small minority are Christians who print and sell the Scriptures to an increasing number of interested people.

The officers of the local branch were returned by acclamation.
