TENDER FOR SCARIFICATION

Tenders for scarification are requested to tunnel approximately 300 acres of brushy and grassy sites in the Limestone Lake area of the Geraldton Forest District using a crawler type tractor with a minimum of 120 rated net horsepower.

The successful tenderer will carry out a blade-type of scarification using a V-blade supplied by the Ministry of Natural Resources.

Work should commence about August 1st, 1972 and be completed by August 31, 1972. Tenders will be accepted for one (1) machine only.

Tender forms and details can be obtained from Chief Ranger, Macdiarmid.

A Certified Cheque in the amount of \$250.00 as a Performance Bond must accompany the tender form.

Tenders must show the rate per hour including operator and be submitted to the District Forester, Geraldton on or before 12 o'clock noon, E.S.T., July 28th, 1972.

**ARTISTS TO TOUR ONTARIO:
TO VISIT TERRACE BAY JULY 27, 28, & 29**

People of all ages in northern Ontario will be able to participate in a travelling artistic workshop again this summer.

The Ontario government is operating Art Trek on a larger scale this summer as a result of its unqualified success in 1971.

This year Art Trek is made up of six teams of two talented young artists each. They will travel in vans full of art materials to some 60 communities conducting casual participation workshops in painting, drawing, batik, lino-printing and sculpture.

Lee Thomas, Art Trek's co-ordinator, said, "The programme is mainly for the teenage community, but any interested people willing to take an active part in the workshops are welcome."

The programme is free. Art Trek is sponsored by the Youth and Recreation Branch of the Ministry of Community and Social Services. Workshops will be conducted day and night in order to involve as many people as possible.

Roberto Carbone, a member of last year's Art Trek, and Bob Hirano, a fourth-year student in the fine arts programme at the University of Windsor will make the journey to the northern part of the province.

"We're really anxious to get up north", said Mr. Carbone. He explained the kind of workshops they conduct will depend on the individual community's

needs.

Local artists and art enthusiasts can bring their own materials and discuss the problems they have encountered in their work.

Mr. Carbone's speciality is painting and Mr. Hirano's is sculpture but both artists will teach a variety of art forms.

They will hit the road at the end of July and wind up their tour on Labour Day.

The team will spend up to four or five days in each community. If you are interested in taking part in Art Trek call the Recreation Office at 3542 and leave your name and phone number.

This tour will include stops as far north as Moosonee on James Bay and Red Lake near the Manitoba border.

All of the Art Trek artists have three things in common - artistic ability, the desire to share that ability in a give and take experience with Ontarians, plus an enthusiastic attitude about their upcoming Art Trek summer.
