"Summersounds will bring a worthwhile cultural event to communities throughout the province."

Mr. Boyman explained that Summersounds is more than just a series of concerts. He said, "The musicians will be billeted in private homes to encourage a give-and-take experience between them and the host familites."

He also emphasized the importance of stimulating the development of talented young musicians in Ontario.

Summersounds '72 is sponsored by the Ministry of Community and Social Services, Youth and Recreation Branch. The success of last summer's tour encouraged the government to expand the programme as part of a group of programmes that are alternatives to summer employment.

Both groups will perform informal and formal indoor and outdoor concerts in all conceivable community situations.

Mr. Boyman indicated where possible the concerts will be held in association with community festivals or special events. Summersounds performances will include shows at the Peterborough "Water and Arts Festival" and Sharbot Lake's Annual Summer Social.

Some of the other likely concerts will be at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa and the St. Lawrence Centre and Ontario Place in Toronto. The tours will combine for the concerts in Ottawa and Toronto.

The musicians - singers and instrumentalists - were chosen from over 350 hopefuls at auditions in Toronto, Ottawa, Thunder Bay, London, Waterloo, and Sudbury.

The auditions were conducted by Walter Cavalieri the artistic co-ordinator and the two music directors, Barbara Spence and Bruce Pennycook.

Mr. Cavalieri is known to Torontonians for his work as production stage manager and regional artistic director for the Toronto production of "Hair" He turned down a position with Godspell in order to be with Summersounds.
