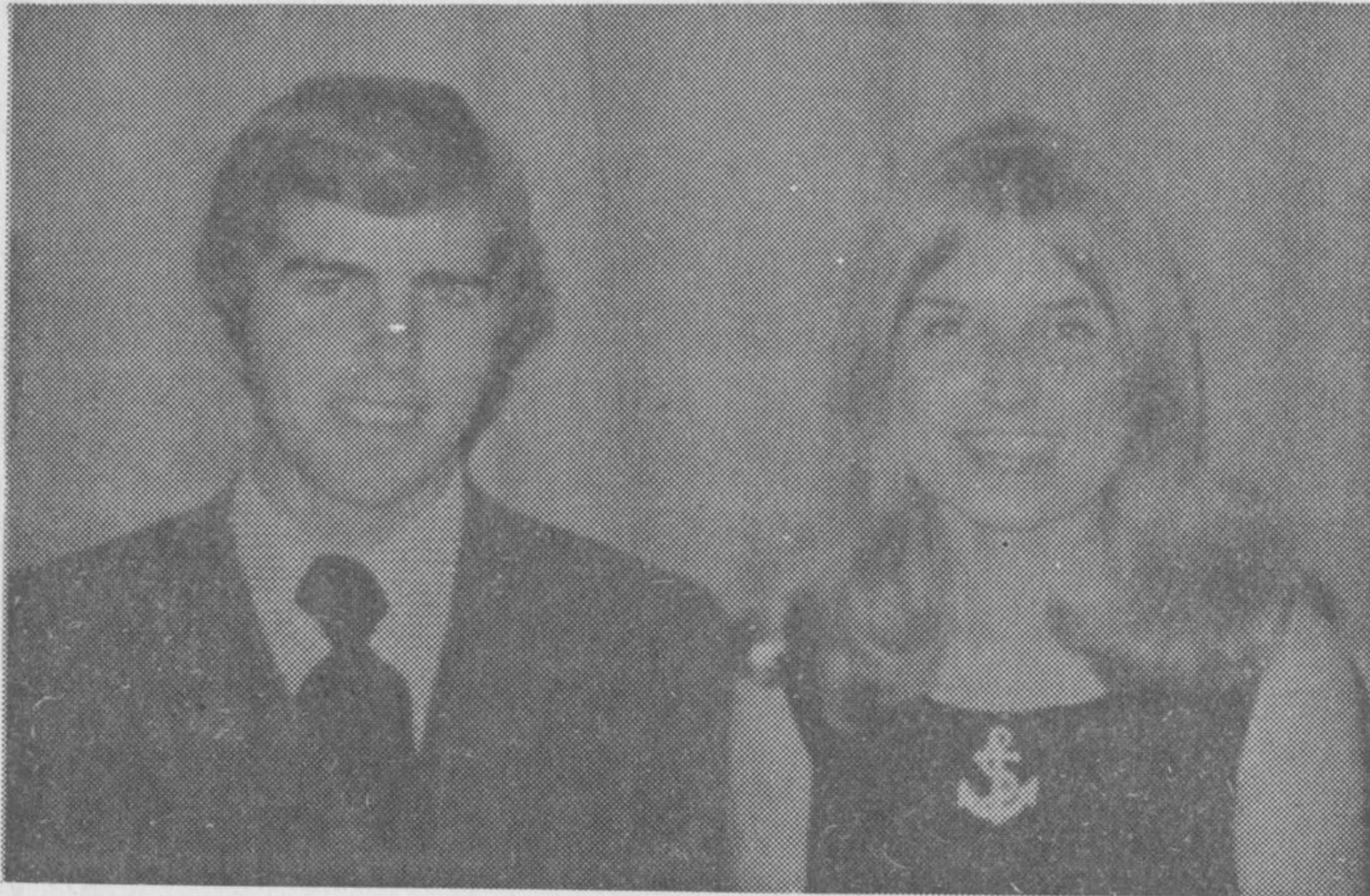


ENGAGEMENT ANNOUNCEMENT

RULE 17

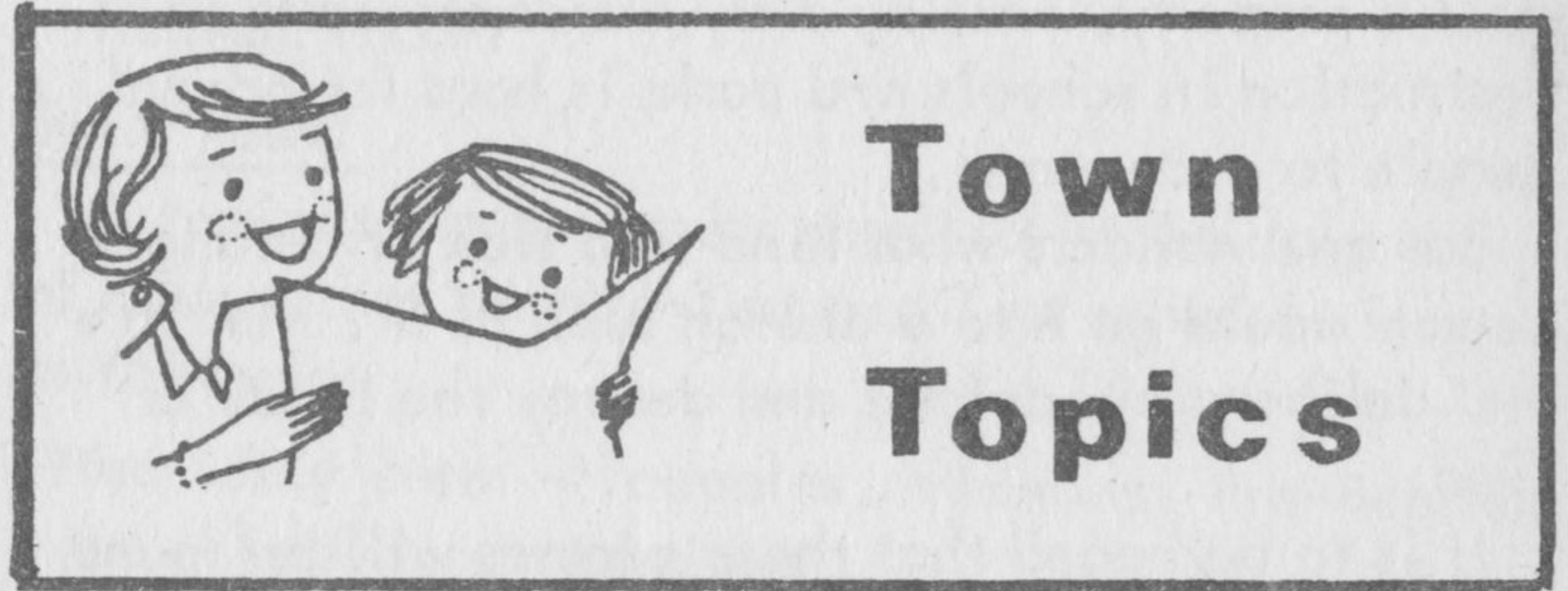
A player shall not improve or allow to be improved, his line of play, the position of lie of his ball or the area of his intended swing, by moving bending or breaking anything fixed or growing, or by removing or pressing down sand, loose soil, cut turf placed in position or other irregularities of surface which could in anyway affect a player's lie, except -
 a. As may occur in the course of fairly taking his stance. B. In making the stroke or the backward movement of his club for the stroke. c. When teeing a ball.

The club may be grounded only lightly and must not be pressed on the ground (sand and loose soil on the putting green).

If a ball lie in long grass, rushes, bushes, whins, heather or the like, only so much thereof shall be touched as will enable the player to find and identify

his ball; nothing shall be done which may in any way improve its lie.
 The player is not of necessity entitled to see the ball when playing a stroke.
