By-Law 242 was given third reading and passed, being a by-law governing the clearing of grounds.

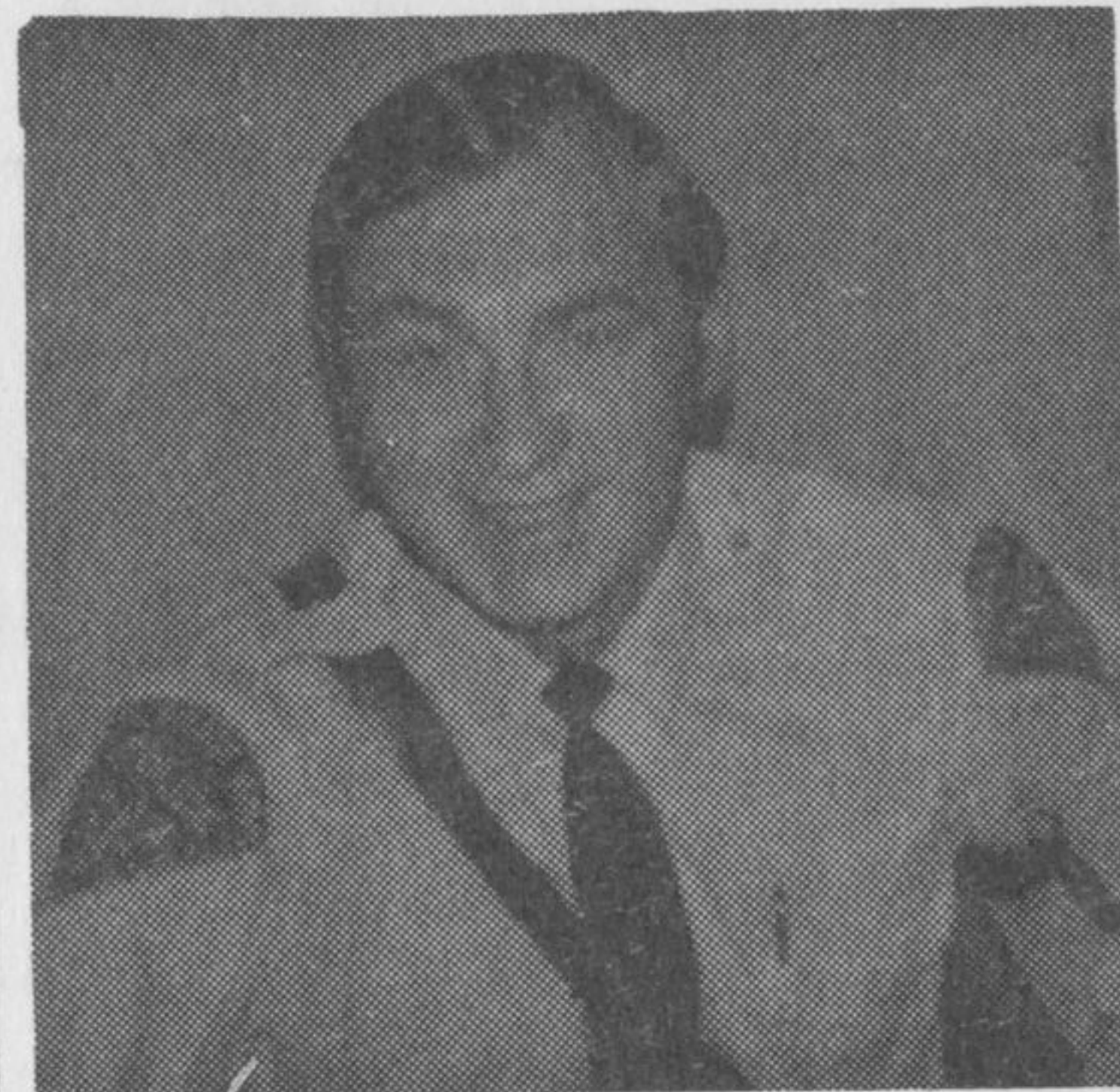
By-Law 254 was given first and second readings, being a by-law to provide a Sick Leave for permanent employees.
