NEW ELECTION PROCEDURES

Nominations:

A candidate may be nominated for an office by the filing, during the period in which candidates may be nominated, (November 9th to 13th) in the office of the clerk during his normal office hours of a nomination papers in prescribed form, which,

(a) shall be signed by at least ten electors, whose

names are entered in the polling lists of electors entitled to vote in an election to such office;

(b) shall state the name, occupation and address of the candidate in such manner as will identify him and the office for which he is nominated; and

(c) shall state the name and address of each elector signing the nomination paper, and where the office for which the candidate is nominated is a member of a school board, that such nominator is a public school elector or separate school elector, as the fact is.

A nomination paper for a candidate to be elected by public school electors shall be signed by public school electors only.

A nomination paper for a candidate to be elected by separate school electors shall be signed by separate school electors only. Each candidate for election to an office shall be nominated by a separate nomination paper, but an elector may sign the nomination paper of different candidates.
