Mrs. Jessie McCanna, PNG and W. Jones, PNG, presided for the meeting as noble grand and vice grand respectively.



Although this is his first try in local politics he was previously involved in the railroad Union. Mr. Holmes was born and raised in


Schreiber and will serve the community to his full capacity.




Mr. H.H. Fischer a railroad conductor, is again seeking re-election to the municipal Council after completing six years service.
