POLICY FOR SNOWMOBILES ON KIMBERLY-CLARK ROADS:

It is the policy of Kimberly-Clark of Canada Ltd. at Terrace Bay to consider snowmobiles in the same category as automobiles, trucks and other motor vehicles, that is, if the driver is sixteen years or older, and has the minimum public liability insurance that the law demands, then this snowmobile can be driven on mill roads in the same manner as any other motor vehicle.

Snowmobiles are not allowed in the Woodyard or any other area where motor vehicles are prohibited. The roads into these areas are posted. It is necessary that all snowmobiles abide by the same rules governing speed and safety that apply to other motor vehicles while travelling or crossing mill roads and property, in that they must drive in the interest of public safety.

Snowmobilers are allowed to park their machines on the lawn area behind the small meeting room (cenotaph area) and can use the back entrance of the Recreation Centre. The reason for this request is because of complaints
