In addition, we have already assured the Board of McCausland Hospital and our own associates in the Ontario Ministry of Health, that we in the Ministry of Community and Social Services will cooperate with them in every way to help them serve the health needs of your community. Your Recreation Centre, too, is of interest to my Ministry. Our emphasis, of course, will be on social service, accommodation and activity programs.

I wish to ask the representatives and employees of Kimberly-Clark, labour and management, and all visitors, for help in making this a truly community spirited project. Your understanding and cooperation at this time of transition is essential, and your continued support of the coming programs of this Senior Citizens' Residence and Centre will go a long way toward making our joint Terrace Bay project one of the best of its kind in Ontario.
