2½% ON ALL PAYMENTS PRIOR TO MAR. 1, 1973
2% ON ALL PAYMENTS PRIOR TO APR. 1, 1973

These discounts reduce by ½% per month up to June 30, 1973.

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THIS TAX PAYMENT ARRANGEMENT UNDER THE TAX PRE-PAYMENT SCHEME.
