TERRACE BAY POLICE DETACHMENT REPORT

Twenty-seven general occurrences were investigated by the Terrace Bay Police Department last week.

The week started with a break, enter and theft at the Woodlands workshop when entry had been gained by chopping a hole in the wall with an axe (also stolen). During investigation the following day it was reported that two further break and enters had occurred at the North Camp garages when a car had been stolen from one garage and an attempt to steal a further car from another garage.
