He said the policy of the Ontario Government has been to promote more equitable distribution of wages for work performed. For example, he noted that Ontario was the first province to actively promote equal pay for equal work.

He said the purpose of the minimum wage is to ensure the highest possible wage rate for low-paid workers while at the same time preventing unemployment among workers due to high labour costs.
