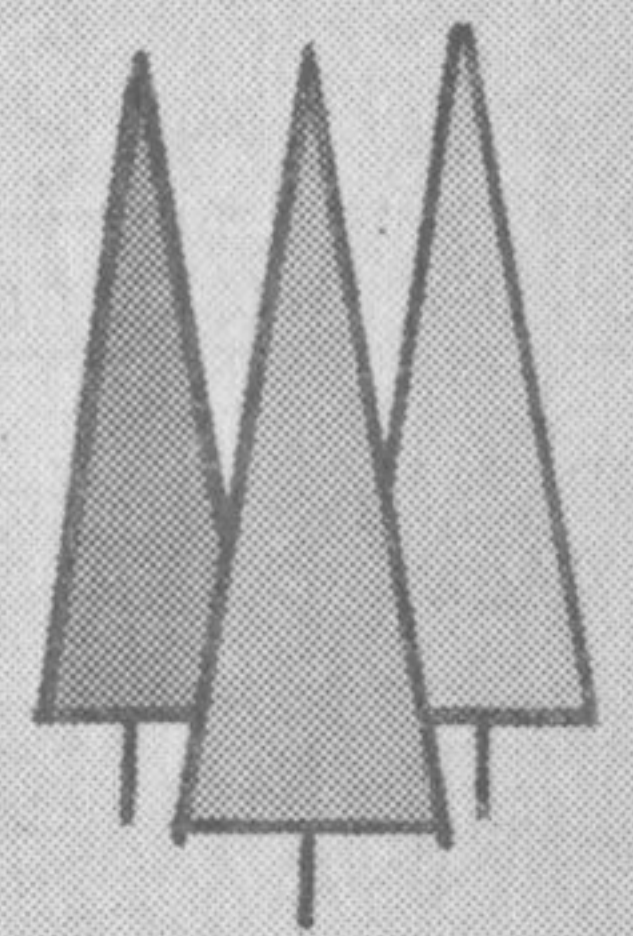

COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve R. Bray presided over the Council meeting on Tuesday evening, with Councillors Helmink, Hale, Brassard and Megraw all present.

Mr. Les Kruger, Coach of the Junior Hockey team, elaborated on a request for funds, in lieu of the donation offered last year for photographs which unfortunately were not taken. Council passed a grant for \$50.00, but suggested any further requests be made to the Recreation Committee.

Police Chief David Barnett gave his monthly report.

Minutes of the last meeting were adopted as read.

Correspondence included a letter from the Boy Scout Association requesting permission to hold a huge bonfire at the top of the Ski Hill at the end of the Winter Carnival ceremonies on Sunday night. This was granted.

Requests for assistance from the Salvation Army and St. John's Ambulance were turned down, since these organizations are assisted in other ways by the town people.

Pinewood Court, Home for the Aged submitted a financial statement.

The Women of the Moose requested the Town Council to make a donation toward their Mid-Winter Conference which will be held in March. The donation was to be in the form of an article, such as book matches, advertising Terrace Bay, which will be placed in a grab bag, to be given to each visitor.
